What does it mean to be a Stephen Minister?


In 2013 I was one of the first groups trained and commissioned as a Stephen Minister (SM) at Immanuel. During the 11 years as a SM, I have had four Care Receivers (CR). Each CR has had their own unique problems/concerns. As a Care Giver (CG) I would call my CR and meet with her weekly. We would meet at a place of her choice, whether at her home, a park, restaurant, or my home for one hour. During that hour my CR would tell me how she was feeling, she might be sad or depressed, feeling better. She would let me know if she had a good or bad week. There were times we would laugh together and sometimes cry. My main goal as a CG is to be a good listener. Sometimes I would offer suggestions to help her make decisions or changes, but never tell her what she should or should not do. At the close of our meetings, I would pray with her. My last CR said our prayer time and

holding hands was the best part of our meeting. Unfortunately, my first two CR's have passed away, but I still continue to pray for my last two. Once a month our SM team meets to discuss our CR's and how they are doing. SM is based on confidentiality and trust. We never use our CR's name at any point in time.

God led me to become a SM and it has been such a beautiful experience for me. I have grown closer to God, and I know He is always helping and guiding me with my CR. We know only God is our cure giver, but I love being a vessel for loving and helping others as Jesus wants us to do.

I have made lasting friendships with my SM team. Even though I do not currently have a CR I remain friends and see my last CR.

SM is a wonderful based Christian Ministry, and I would highly recommend it for anyone who is searching for help in their life or just needs someone to talk to. It does not matter about your circumstances, we are here to love and support you.


We will meet on November 13th at 10 am in the Room 202 of the Palm City campus.

CLEMENTINE'S LEGACY

Note: The following article has appeared the last five years in this newsletter. With our inperson worship attendance diminished and amid challenges meeting our financial obligations due to increased insurance premiums and historic inflation rates, we received a distribution of \$26,000 from the Clementine Zacke Foundation. It could not have come at a more opportune time.

Allow me to introduce you to Clementine Zacke. Clementine was born on September 13, 1914. She joined Immanuel Lutheran Church on December 4, 1987, almost one month before Immanuel became the first congregation of the new Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). Clementine died on January 25, 1997 at the age of eightytwo years.

But Clementine's story doesn't end there. Nor her relationship with Immanuel. Before her death she had the foresight to create a foundation and establish a trust naming Immanuel as one of its beneficiaries, including the Treasure Coast Hospice and several education entities serving Martin County students.

For the last twenty-seven years **Immanuel** has aratefully received distributions annual from the Clementine Zacke Foundation. The stipulation was that the funds were to be primarily used to support Immanuel's various youth programs and have allowed us to retain a Children, Youth and Family Director. Clementine felt that the youth were the future of the church and the world.

What will be your legacy? Immanuel offers many opportunities to leave a perpetual personal legacy or one honoring or remembering a loved one. In addition to naming Immanuel as a beneficiary in your will or trust, we have three endowment funds as well as our memorial fund.
