The Importance of Advent: A Season of Hopeful Waiting

Dear Friends in Christ,

As we enter the Advent season, Advent wreaths of evergreen appear. Advent is a time of preparation, of waiting, and of hope-a season deeply rooted in the rhythms of our faith and central to our journey as followers of Christ.

The word Advent comes from the Latin adventus, meaning "coming" or "arrival." During these four weeks leading to Christmas, we are invited to pause and reflect on the coming of Jesus in three profound ways: His humble birth in Bethlehem, His daily

presence in our lives, and His promised return in glory. Each of these reminds us of God's faithfulness and love for a world in need of redemption.

But why wait? Why not skip ahead to the joy and celebration of Christmas morning? That's what the rest of the world does.

Advent teaches us that waiting is not wasted time-it's sacred time. In a culture that prizes instant gratification, Advent pulls us back to the slower, more intentional pace of faith. We light the candles one by one, week by week, marking the progression of hope, peace, joy, and love. We lean into the promises of God with hearts tuned to His Word, trusting that even in the waiting, God is at work.

The prophet Isaiah reminds us, "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light" (Isaiah 9:2). In Advent, we acknowledge the darkness-the brokenness of our world and our own lives-and we turn to the One who brings the light of salvation. It's a time to open our hearts in prayer, to mend relationships, to serve our neighbors, and to make space for the Christ child to enter in.

For our Lutheran tradition, Advent is more than a countdown to Christmas. It is a sacred reminder of God's promise to bring renewal and redemption. The season calls us to trust in what we cannot yet see-to trust that God is Immanuel, "God with us," and that God's love continues to transform our lives and our world.

This year I want us to focus on just that, God's love transforming lives and the world. So rather than just skipping Advent and moving on to Christmas, we're going to do something a little different this year. The year we will hang wreathes and set up an Advent tree rather than a Christmas tree. What's the difference? We'll use the same tree, but the decorations will be different. The Advent decorations will be gift cards. We'll have blank gift cards on the tree for you to take and load at the store and bring back. Then those cards will be delivered to Family Promise. God's love transforming lives and the world.

But when will we turn the advent tree into a Christmas Tree? We will transform the tree with our normal Christmas decorations after worship on the 4th Sunday of Advent, December 22nd.


